On Playworks playgrounds across the country, kids play hard, cheer loud and high five with joy. They settle their conflicts quickly and fairly with rock, paper, scissors and they carry a feeling of empowerment and belonging with them into their classrooms, back to their neighborhoods and out into the world. We are in the process of implementing this for our students and expect to see a big impact on our playground and in our classrooms. # Academic Parent Teacher Teams

Desert Star is once again implementing Academic Parent Teacher Teams (APTT) for our family engagement model. If you are new to what APTT is all about, here is more information on why we believe APTT helps us to work together as partners in your child's education.

APTT<sup>®</sup> is a classroom-based, teacher-led, data-driven family engagement model. It is rooted in training families to support children's academic goals by linking home and school learning. APTT is grounded in the notion that schools can thrive when families and teachers work together, as genuine partners, to maximize student learning inside and outside the school. Meaningful partnerships can be set in motion when schools establish a systematic approach to family engagement that gives all families the information, skills, and confidence to be meaningfully engaged in their child's academic success.

During APTT meetings, teachers share student performance data, review grade level foundational skills, and demonstrate activities that parents can do at home to help students master those skills. Each parent sets 60-day academic goals for their student before leaving. When families attend APTT meetings, they go home feeling informed, clear about their role, and committed to improving their child's learning outcomes.



For all team meetings, translation and childcare will be provided.

Also know that students who are consistently tardy tend to struggle in their classes as well. Students who are on time, have had a good breakfast, and plenty of sleep are able to comprehend and focus better throughout the day. ## School-wide Classroom Management Procedures

Every classroom on our campus has the same three rules:

**Be Respectful**

**Be Responsible**

**Be Safe**

While these three rules may look or sound different in a kindergarten classroom versus an eighth grade classroom, all three are fundamental for student learning, safety, and overall well-being.

### K-4th Grade Clip System

All students start on "Green" and it is our goal that every student ends on Green, Blue or even Purple at the end of the day. Students can move up and down on the clip chart during the school day. Teachers will contact parents for consequences, as well as incentives related to this clip system.

**Purple** - Outstanding

**Blue** - Good Choices

**Green** - Ready to Learn

**Yellow** - Slow Down

**Orange** - Think About It

**Red** - Stop & Make a Change



### 5th-8th Grade Stamp System

With our 5th-8th grade students having multiple teachers, we want to ensure that students are held accountable from class to class and we are communicating effectively and efficiently with all our parents. Students in these grades are expected to use their school provided student agendas to write down learning objectives, homework, and receive stamps for behavior reporting.
